UDST Hosts Milestone GCC Universities Sport and Wellness Symposium

University of Doha for Science and Technology (UDST) proudly opens its doors today for the start of its inaugural GCC Universities Sport and Wellness Symposium. The three-day conference brings together senior university sport and wellness leaders, national and international sport federation representatives, government officials, sport experts and university students from across the region. The conference aims to promote growth and foster collaboration for regional student sport opportunities while exploring the importance of wellness in student setting. Held over 14-16 January, 2024, the symposium is organised by UDST's Sport and Wellness Department, with the support of active event partners Federation Internationale du Sport Universitaire (FISU), and the Qatar Collegiate Sport Federation (QCSF).



The symposium commenced with opening remarks presented by Dr. Salem Al Naemi, President of UDST, followed by H.E. Dr. Ibrahim Saleh Al-Naimi, President of QCSF and the Undersecretary of the Ministry of Education and Higher Education in Qatar and Leonz Eder,

President of FISU and President of the Swiss University Sports Foundation.

H.E. Dr. Ibrahim Saleh Al-Naimi, President of QCSF reiterated the importance of building higher education institutions that play a center-stage role in sports at both regional and global levels. He said: "This symposium, is not just fostering sport and wellness in the educational settings, but also nurturing the holistic well-being of our youth. Integrating sports into our educational fabric ensures that physical wellness and academic achievement go hand in hand. We are pleased with the participation of many high-level delegations from the GCC which underscores the importance of collaboration in building healthier, more vibrant university communities across the region."

Commenting on the event, Dr. Salem Al-Naemi, President of University of Doha for Science and Technology said: "UDST, in alignment with Qatar National Vision 2030 that embraces sports as a crucial tool for growth and wellbeing, hosts this event, underscoring Qatar's dedication as a passionate sporting nation. 
The official theme of the conference is "Towards a Vision of Collaboration and Growth", with principal focus on exploring collaborative hosting and competition opportunities across the region, productive discussions on the growth of elite sport within the university sector, and the establishment of a multinational network committed to increasing interuniversity sport and wellness initiatives

across the GCC. Another major topic of the symposium is the FISU "Healthy Campus" program, which advocates for the holistic development of students' physical and mental health. UDST's diverse range of sports programs and services was the first in the MENA region to be recognised by the program and be awarded FISU Platinum status, making it a fitting host for the symposium.

Mr. Tony Martin, Manager of Sport and Wellness at UDST, remarked, "There are over 100 post-secondary institutions already participating in the FISU program, as we are. We hope to inspire more universities to join this transformational wellness initiative, which would elevate the quality of individual university sports for everyone. The GCC region in particular is witnessing a significant shift in the role of higher education institutions in sports development. Dr. Brian spoke about the research project being conducted in the USDT Sport and Wellness Department which involves integrating a health and wellness component during students' first year on campus. This wellness intervention is focused on developing the students' knowledge around physical and mental well-being and how this knowledge can support their academic experience.



Shaping the Future of Digital Safety: UDST's International Symposium on Cybersecurity in Industry

University of Doha for Science and Technology (UDST) hosted the opening ceremony of the International Symposium on Cybersecurity, shining a spotlight on the challenges, opportunities and applications of the practice across a variety of industrial sectors. Hosted by the University's College of Computing and Information Technology (CCIT), the symposium is organized in partnership with Qatar's National Cyber Security Agency (NCSA) and in conjunction with UDST's cybersecurity partner Palo Alto Networks. The pioneering two-day event reflects UDST's strong commitment to Qatar's vision: to be ahead of the curve on matters of IT-related and Internet security.

Among the special guests attending were H.E. Eng. Abdulrahman Ali Al-Malki, President of NCSA and Dr. Salem Al-Naemi, President of UDST alongside high-level delegations.

The overarching theme of the international symposium is "Cybersecurity in Industry: Challenges, Opportunities, and Applications". The event features an impressive array of keynote speakers and subject matter experts from Qatar, Germany and the USA, offering deep insights and varied perspectives, and bringing together a diverse audience of local, regional and international technology enthusiasts, faculty, students, ICT managers and industry professionals.



Dr. Salem Al-Naemi, President of UDST said: "This event represents collective efforts that aim to discuss and tackle challenges in a world increasingly dependent on digital infrastructure and highlight the importance of cybersecurity that has emerged as a cornerstone of national and international security. Advancing Innovation: UDST Hosts 2nd International Workshop on 3D Printing

University of Doha for Science and Technology (UDST) hosted the opening of the 2nd International Workshop on 3D Printing for Applied Technologies. The two-day event is organized by the University's College of Engineering and Technology and is based on the resounding success of last year's inaugural workshop, where over 150 participants attended. This year's event brings together local and international experts from a diverse range of technical backgrounds to present key advancements on the topic, helping solidify UDST's central role in Qatar's 3D printing landscape.

A number of distinguished guests and partners attended the event and speakers from across the globe, including Dr Robert Kay, Professor of Advanced Manufacturing at the University of Leeds; Dr. Derya Daran Associate Professor in Material Science and Engineering from the King Abdullah University of Science and Technology (KAUST) in Saudi Arabia; Dr. Jang-Ung Park, Professor in the Department of Materials Science and Engineering from the Yonsei University, Republic of Korea; Mr Riccardo Nicastro, Group Chief Commercial Officer for Caracol AM in Italy; Mrs Vesna Covic Palikuca, Lecturer and Mechanical Instructor in the Mechanical Engineering Department at UDST; and Dr Ehab Saleh, Assistant Professor in Smart Manufacturing at UDST, and Technical Chair of this year's workshop.

Dr. Salem Al-Naemi, President of UDST said: "Hosting this workshop for the second year running shows our commitment to progress and education in the fields of industrial technologies such as 3D Printing. This technology is estimated to lead the 4th industrial revolution, it is utilized

in the healthcare sector, the aeronautical and automotive industry, manufacturing, construction, education, and much more. We strongly believe that to get the best possible results, industry and academia must come together to provide valuable opportunities for students, where they can learn from, and interact with, experts. This helps equip our students with the knowledge and skills they require to succeed."



3D printing is a revolutionary form of manufacturing solid objects from digital models. It enables the production of complex structures that traditional manufacturing methods are unable to achieve. UDST's workshop will focus on the latest advancements in 3D printing and its application in metals, ceramics and polymers, including the production of stretchable electronics and printed wearables. Last year, UDST introduced its Bachelor of Science in Mechanical Engineering - Smart Manufacturing Engineering as part of a continued commitment to lead the way in the realm of 3D printing and industrial technology.



Dr. Awni Al-Otoom, Dean of UDST's College of Engineering and Technology, said: "3D printing is a transformative technology, and a key element of our Smart Manufacturing curriculum. Just as last year, we are once again extending a valuable opportunity for both students and faculty to engage with industry leaders and gain a broad perspective on the latest applications of 3D printing. Technology initiatives like this workshop give UDST the edge as an applied educational establishment, and our students a significant advantage when landing graduate employment."

On the second day of the workshop, attendees were treated to a specialized training session focused on the fundamentals of 3D printing and reverse engineering. This hands-on session will allow participants to gain practical experience and a deeper understanding of the 3D printing operational cycle.

The regional finalists will now participate in the global finals of the Huawei ICT Competition, which will take place in May 2024 in China.

and Technology's commitment to fostering experiential learning, nurturing industry-academic collaborations, and maintaining a standard of academic excellence.













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
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
